IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious INSTRUCTIONS-SAVE THESE OPERATOR'S MANUAL CONTAINS IMPORTANT SAFETY AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS.

•AVOID DANGEROUS ENVIRONMENTS. Do not charge battery in rain, snow, damp or wet locations. Do not use battery or harger in the presence of explosive atmospheres (gaseous fumes, dust or flammable materials) because sparks may be generated possibly causing fire.

•CHARGE IN A WELL VENTILATED AREA. Do not block charger vents. Keep them clear to allow proper ventilation. Do not allow smoking or open flames near a charging battery. Vented gases may explode.

- •MAINTAIN CORD. When unplugging charger, pull plug rather than cord to reduce the risk of damage to the electrical plug and cord. Never carry charger by its cord. Keep cord from heat, oil and sharp edges. Make sure cord will not be stepped on, tripped over or subjected to damage or stress. Do not use charger with damaged cord or plug. Have a damaged charger replaced immediately.
- •USE ONLY RECOMMENDED ATTACHMENTS. Use of an attachment not recommended or sold by the battery charger or battery manufacturer may result in a risk of fire, electric shock or personal injury

•TO REDUCE THE RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK, charger before cleaning unplug maintenance.

•DO NOT BURN OR INCINERATE BATTERY PACKS. Battery may explode, causing personal injury or damage. Toxic fumes and materials are created when battery are burned.

•DO NOT CRUSH, DROP, OR DAMAGE BATTERY.

Do not use a battery or charger that has received a sharp blow, been dropped, run over, or damaged in any way (e.g., pierced with a nail, hit with a hammer, stepped on).

ADDITIONAL BATTERY SAFETY RULES



Corrosive or conductive fluids, such as seawater, industrial chemicals, and bleach bleach-containing products, etc., can cause a short circuit.

BATTERY

Maintenance and Storage

Limit exposure of your product to water or Tain, or allow them to get wet. Do not use oil or solvents to clean or lubricate your tool. The plastic casing will become brittle and crack, causing a risk of injury.

Store product at room temperature away from moisture. Do not store in damp locations where corrosion of terminals may occur. Permanent capacity loss can result if the product is stored for long periods of time at high temperatures (over 48°C). After about a year of storage, charge the product as normal.

Charging the Battery

 Plug your USB cable into a power source such as an AC wall adaptor, computer or car port.

- Lift the rubber cover to access the USB-C port. Insert the USB-C plug into the USB-C port. Users may experience longer charge times from laptops and other power sources.
- 3. The indicator light will display the charging status:

Red Flashing: Charging, 0-49% Charged Yellow Flashing: Charging, 50-99% Charged Green Solid: 100% Charged

Red Solid: Hot Battery Red/Green Flashing: Cold, Wet, or Faulty

If the light continues to flash red and green, the battery may be cold, wet, faulty, or the battery did not fully charge after 12 hours. If the light is solid red, the battery is too hot. Allow the battery to cool down, warm up, or dry out. Turn the light on or plug in for charging. If the problem persists, contact a MILWAUKEE® service facility.

Operation

ACAUTION To reduce the risk of injury, do not look directly into the light when the light is on.

Connect the light onto the strap and use the buckle to adjust the strap to the required size. Use the included clips to attach to a hard hat. Rotate the light up or down as needed.

Press the power button Φ to turn the light on and off. Press the mode button to cycle through the light intensities.

The battery indicator light will display the battery capacity for 3 seconds as the light is being turned on or off.

Green Solid: 50-100% remaining Yellow Solid: 10-49% remaining Red Solid: 3-9% remaining

During use, when the battery charge reaches 3%, the main LED and charge indicator will flash, indicating up to 5 minutes of runtime remains. Prior to immediate shutdown, the main LED will flash 3 times, then the light will shutdown. Remaining runtime may be less than 5 minutes if the light is turned on when battery capacity is already 0-3%.

Undertemperature condition (<-20°C):

If the battery is above 50% charged, the light will turn on at 100 lumens and stay at 100 lumens until low battery conditions.

If the battery is below 50% charged, the light will turn at 15 lumens and stay at 15 lumens while in use.

Overtemperature condition (>55°C):

The light will enter a lower output to reduce flashlight temperature.

Once the light has returned to normal operating temperatures, the light will resume normal operation.

AWARNING

To reduce the risk of injury, always unplug product and remove from the charger before performing any maintenance. Never disassemble the tool, battery pack or charger. Contact a MILWAUKEE® service facility for ALL repairs.

Maintaining Tool

Keep the tool, battery pack and charger in good repair by adopting a regular maintenance program. Return the tool, battery pack, and charger to a MILWAUKEE® service facility for repair.

Cleaning

Clean dust and debris from vents. Keep handles clean, dry and free of oil or grease. Use only mild soap and a damp cloth to clean, since certain cleaning agents and solvents are harmful to plastics and other insulated parts. Some of these include gasoline, turpentine, lacquer thinner, paint thinner, chlorinated cleaning solvents, ammonia and household detergents containing ammonia. Never use flammable or combustible solvents around tools.

Repairs

This tool has limited serviceable parts including a non-replaceable battery pack. Do not open housing or disassemble tool. For repairs, return the tool, battery pack and charger to the nearest authorised service centre.

AWARNING The light source of this luminaire is not replaceable; when the light source reaches its end of life the whole luminaire shall be replaced.
